GUIDE AND PACKING



ITEMS TO BRING ON YOUR WILDERNESS ADVENTURE

- Medium sized duffle bag, so it can be packed on a horse, no hard cases, or bags with wheels, or military type duffle bags. Please do not bring oversized duffle bags (see example below).
- Well broken in foot wear
- Tennis-type shoes
- Warm sweaters and jackets for those chilly evenings
- Lightweight thermal underwear tops and bottoms
- Quality light-weight rain gear (no ponchos)
- Hat and gloves
- Bandana
- Extra pair of prescription glasses (if applicable)
- Sun glasses
- Sunscreen & chapstick
- Personal towel
- Personal hygiene items (biodegradable, please)
- Light-weight camera and extra batteries
- STUFFABLE sleeping bag (must be good for 30 degrees)
- Good quality water bottles (Nalgene/Hydro-Flask, etc.)
- Flashlight or headlamp & extra batteries
- A small day pack
- Swiss Army-type pocket knife
- Fishing rod (must be collapsible and not exceed three feet when collapsed)

Fishing Licenses

Purchase a three-day license that will start on the Tuesday of your tour.

Ideal Duffel Bag
Dimensions:
30" Length x 12" Width x
18" Height

The items above are important to have and are usually the ones that are forgotten or overlooked. Do not limit yourself to this list, bring whatever you need. There will be a place for you to safely stow your personal belongings that you do not intend to take into the backcountry. Your sleeping bag will be packed separately from your duffel bag, so there is no need to fit your sleeping bag in your duffel bag. There will also be saddle bags on your horse for your water bottles, lunch, cameras, etc.
